DOCK HOURS

Please note the docks in Le Marin Marina close at 7:30pm.

Be advised all clients who order a taxi after 7:30pm that the taxi will have a code to access the docks.

EMBARKATION TIME

Embarkation time is 5:30pm. Technical briefing will be carried out the following morning.

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YACHT BRIEFING

All briefings are conducted on the chartered yacht and will take 40-90 minutes, depending on yacht size and crew experience. The team will give a detailed walk-through of your yacht's technical equipment, information about safe and accurate navigation, including the yacht's navigational instruments, as well as mooring, anchorage and itinerary help. The safety briefing introduces the safety equipment and your yacht's general inventory.

STOP OVERS

First and last night stop overs at the marina are free.

DISEMBARKATION TIME

Disembarkation is at 10am.

To assist in making checkout as smooth as possible, we ask that you arrive at the dock the night before disembarkation with a full tank (s) of fuel, water and gasoline for the dinghy. It is also required that all dirty linens be put in garbage bags and placed in the salon area. Please remove all garbage from boat. All snorkel gear should be rinsed and free of sand.

The team will inspect your yacht's equipment and a general visual check of its interior and exterior. A diver will check its hull, keel, rudder(s) propeller(s) and /or bow thruster. General inspection will take approximately one hour.

BAGGAGE

Please only take soft bags and not suitcases, as they would be too cumbersome onboard.

HOW TO GET THERE?

ACCESS BY PLANE

Martinique Aimé Césaire International Airport (FDF): The airport is 43km from the base, which is a 45-minute journey by car/shuttle. There are regular flights via major airlines from the eastern US cities: from Miami or Fort Lauderdale (3 hours 45 minutes) with American Airlines and New York JFK or Providence TF Green PVD (4 hours 25 minutes) with Norwegian Air International. TRANSFERS FROM THE AIRPORT TO OUR BASE

If you need an organized transfer from the airport, please contact our base manager. Major car rental companies operate from the airport, please refer to airport website for info, working hours and contacts. Taxis are regularly available in front of the airport buildings.

AREA GUIDE

LOCAL AREA INTRODUCTION

Martinique is one of the shining jewels of the French Caribbean and is part of the Windward Islands in the Lesser Antilles. It has flawless beaches with white sand on the south coast and dramatic black volcanic sand on the north coast. Enjoy swimming and snorkeling among coral reefs or visit pretty fishing villages, hot springs, thick rainforests and rugged peaks.

The capital of Martinique, Fort-de-France, celebrates every aspect of French culture with style and panache, from the excellence of its cuisine to the chic sophistication of its fine resorts and hotels. Shops, art galleries, theatres and museums all pay homage to its French heritage, and you can watch boules being played in the squares while people sit and chat outside cafés.

TOP THINGS TO DO IN MARTINIQUE:

- 1. Walk the gardens at Jardin de Balata:** Discover the most beautiful flowers and trees of Martinique in these gardens located in Fort-de-France. Amateur botanists and bird watchers alike will enjoy the peaceful, well-manicured grounds.
- 2. Snorkeling in Anse d'Arlet:** We'd recommend cruising to the village of Anse d'Arlet on the southwest coast for snorkeling along the rocky shoreline. Green sea turtles can sometimes be spotted in the grassy areas off the beach.
- 3. Tour the rum factories:** Martinique is well known for the unique rums that have been produced there for centuries. There are 10 distilleries on-island for exploring, and tasting!
- 4. Visit the waterfalls at Les Gorges de la Falaise:** Bring only bathing suits and waterproof gear for this fully drenched adventure where you can hike along the river to the falls.
- 5. Sail to the Tobago Cays:** Cruise toward the renowned Tobago Cays, which is an itinerary highlight. With their glittering cobalt waters and white sand beaches, this location is ideal for snorkeling, swimming and relaxing.

CURRENCY: The currency in Martinique is the **Euro**, while it is the **Eastern Caribbean Dollar** for other nearby islands (St. Lucia and St. Vincent, etc).

INTERNET

The Wi-Fi in Martinique is free at our marina. Getting online is easy with plenty of Wi-Fi spots in restaurants and cafes, but you may find that speeds vary.

ENVIRONMENT

- Respect your surroundings and leave only footprints in the sand
- Only use the engine or genset when needed (fill up your tanks for the water maker at the docks when you can)
- Recycle your garbage in the correct containers at the marina

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- Respect regulations around marine reserves and private islands where disembarking is not permitted

REGULATIONS

Night sailing is not permitted. Fishing with a line or a rod is permitted except in marine parks. Spearfishing in Martinique is forbidden.

SAILING CONDITIONS

SAILING AREA

Depart from Le Marin and cruise along the coast with stops at Petite Anse d'Arlet, Fort de France and St. Pierre, or sail south to the neighboring island of St. Lucia and explore the waterfalls, hot springs and volcano at Soufrière.

For longer stays on your Martinique yacht charter, you can sail farther afield to St. Vincent and the Grenadines islands, including Bequia, Mustique, Mayreau, the Tobago Cays, and many more.

WEATHER

The best time to visit Martinique is between December and April, while the shoulder seasons of May to June and October to November offer fewer crowds.

The average temperature in Martinique is low to mid-80°Fs all year with relatively high humidity.

TEMPERATURE

Climate in Martinique:

- Summer high: The August high is around 88°F
- Winter low: The December low is 70°F

WIND SYSTEMS

Martinique wind systems typically blow ESE or ENE. The "Christmas Winds" in December and January tend to be stronger and can occasionally reach 30 knots for a few days. From January to mid-April, the northeast trade winds blow steadily and with moderate intensity. From mid-June to mid-November the winds are more irregular yet remain pleasant.
