*Obligatory to fill in and confirm the crew list to your Sales agent minimum 3 days prior check in for the Local authorities to be able to confirm it. If the crew list has not been confirmed 3 days before check in, the technical check in will not be possible the same day, but the next.*

## EMBARKATION TIME

Boarding time is from 5pm till 7pm.

## YACHT BRIEFING

The chart and technical briefing take approximately one hour. All briefings are conducted on the chartered yacht and will take 40-90 minutes, depending on yacht size and crew experience

The team will give a detailed walk-through of your yacht's technical equipment, information about safe and accurate navigation, including the yacht's navigational instruments, as well as mooring, anchorage and itinerary help. The safety briefing introduces the safety equipment and your yacht's general inventory.

## STOP OVERS

You must spend the last night in the marina and arrive before 5pm. On check out fuel tank must be full.

## DISEMBARKATION TIME

To facilitate a smooth check-out process, all yachts must return to the marina no later **than 5:00 PM on the day prior the official check-out**. Please be aware that Fridays are particularly busy, especially at the marina's fuel station, and that each yacht is subject to both a **technical inspection** and an **underwater check by a diver**.

If you have an early departure flight on Saturday and intend to **disembark before 9:00 AM**, we kindly suggest returning to the marina earlier on Friday to ensure a smooth and stress-free departure.

Before returning the yacht, please ensure the following:

1. **Remove all personal belongings** from the boat.
2. Place all **safety equipment neatly on the saloon table** for inspection.
3. **All culinary items**, including dishes, glassware, cutlery, and cooking utensils, **must be washed** and returned to their assigned positions.
4. **Dispose of any trash** in the designated bins ashore (ensure all garbage is **properly separated** as failure to do so may lead to penalties).
5. **Notify the base manager** or technician upon completion.

It is mandatory to leave the boat by 9:00 AM on check-out day.

The team will inspect your yacht's equipment and a general visual check of its interior and exterior. A diver will check its hull, keel, rudder(s) propeller(s) and /or bow thruster. General inspection will take approximately one hour.



## BAGGAGE

Please only take soft bags and not suitcases, as they would be too cumbersome onboard.

For your convenience, Marina Baotić provides secure luggage storage for €3 per bag per day.

## CAR PARKING

Daily car parking is available for €10 per day, payable at the Dream Yacht office.

## HOW TO GET THERE?

---

### ACCESS BY PLANE

Split Airport (SPU): The airport is 9km from the base, which is a 15-minute journey by car.

### ACCESS BY ROAD

From the airport take the street Ulica Dr. Franje Tuđmana to Trogir. When you pass Trogir continue to Seget by street Ulica Hrvatskih žrtava. When you arrive to Seget, the marina is on the left side.

### ACCESS BY BUS

Take local bus number 37 to city Trogir (15 minutes). From Trogir to the marina in Seget it takes 15 minutes by foot.

## AREA GUIDE

---

### LOCAL AREA INTRODUCTION

There may be no better way to explore Trogir's castles, churches, palaces, towers and the rich history on Croatia's Adriatic coast than aboard a yacht. In fact, a Trogir yacht charter starts and ends a short walk from the rich, living history of this UNESCO World Heritage site.

From our base in Marina Baotic, Trogir you'll be right in the heart of a wide variety of islands, old towns, protected parks and some of the best cruising on the Adriatic. The peak summer months for a Trogir yacht charter are July and August. That's when the days are sunny and hot and the water temperatures are ideal for swimming.

The locals love to explore the coast during the months of May and September. The skies are sunny, the temperatures are cooler and there are fewer crowds.

To sail Trogir, you will need a sailing license that is recognized by the local port authorities, or you can hire a skipper. Read our guide to sailing qualifications for more information.

### TOP THINGS TO DO IN TROGIR:

1. **Sail to Šolta Island in time for sunset:** It's the perfect spot to venture out and explore many of the central Dalmatian Islands during your Trogir sailing charter.
2. **Swim, Snorkel, dive, and fish off the island of Brac:** There are lots of things to do in Brac, as it's one of the larger islands. It has 11 towns and villages and is home to the resorts of Supetar and Bol, both famous for fabulous beaches.
3. **Visit the Pakleni Islands:** The islands in this small sub-group of the central Dalmatians are known for magnificent beaches, and their old world charm.
4. **Go shopping (and dancing) in the picturesque village of Komiza:** Komiza is known for its pleasant shops, restaurants, and popular nightclub a short distance from the village center on Kamencia Beach.
5. **Walk Trogir's Old City:** If you're on a Trogir sailing charter, make sure to take time to walk through the walled city and visit its numerous gothic cathedrals.

### **CUSTOMS CLEARANCE**

If you're sailing around Trogir you do not need to worry about customs clearance. However, if you want to sail to nearby Montenegro please talk to us before booking.

Wi-Fi in Trogir is generally reliable, and most cities and towns offer hotspots in bars, restaurants, and hotels. Marina Baotić in Trogir provides free Wi-Fi, and you can also rent a portable Wi-Fi device for your charter at the Dream Yacht office.

### **ENVIRONMENT**

- Respect your surroundings and leave only footprints in the sand
- Only use the engine or genset when needed (fill up your tanks for the water maker at the docks when you can)
- Recycle your garbage in the correct containers at the marina
- Respect regulations around marine reserves and private islands where disembarking is not permitted

## **BEWARE OF POSIDONIA SEAGRASS MEADOWS!**

---

You are going to be sailing in areas where there are Posidonia seagrass meadows. We urge you to be extremely vigilant. These meadows form crucial underwater ecosystems in the Mediterranean, but they are fragile and threatened by a number of human activities, in particular anchoring of recreational craft.

### **An underwater plant of the Mediterranean**

Posidonia (*Posidonia oceanica*) is a unique marine plant that's endemic to the Mediterranean Sea. It is not a seaweed but a true flowering plant, with roots, stems, leaves and flowers. You'll recognise it by its long, green, ribbon-shaped leaves. Posidonia grows in meadows, forming vast underwater prairies. It reproduces mainly by rhizomes and sometimes by seeds.

Posidonia meadows are found in the shallow coastal waters of the Mediterranean, from a depth of 1

to around 40 metres, in clear, well-lit waters. These meadows are particularly abundant in sheltered bays where conditions of temperature, salinity and light are ideal for their growth.

Practically the whole of the Mediterranean coastline is involved here: the shores of France, Italy, Croatia, Greece, Spain, Turkey, Tunisia, and more.

### **An essential ecological role**

Posidonia seagrass meadows provide a habitat and a source of food for a multitude of marine species, including fish, molluscs and crustaceans. They are also ideal spawning grounds and nurseries for young fish.

Like real underwater forests, seagrass beds act as carbon sinks, helping to combat climate change: they can store up to 300 tonnes of carbon per hectare. That's 3 to 5 times more than tropical forests, and this, over hundreds of thousands of hectares. And not to mention their contribution to the production of oxygen, the protection of coasts by attenuating the impact of waves, the preservation of beaches where it accumulates in banks, etc. The loss of these meadows would have serious ecological and economic consequences for the Mediterranean.

### **A protected species under threat**

Despite their importance, Posidonia meadows are extremely fragile and are threatened by a number of human activities. Boat anchoring, pollution, coastal urbanisation, trawling and climate change are all factors that contribute to their degradation. Seagrass beds are particularly sensitive to anchoring by boats: anchors can uproot these plants and create almost irreparable 'scars' in Posidonia meadows, as Posidonia rhizomes grow very slowly (a rate of just 1 cm per year).

The presence of these meadows dates back between 60 and 100 million years, when [terrestrial flowering plants](#), which resembled the rushes plant family of today, returned to the marine environment where their distant ancestors came from. Don't be the one to destroy this extraordinary heritage in a matter of minutes.

**Please note:** Posidonia has been a protected species throughout the Mediterranean since 1995 and is classed as a habitat of European interest. Ensure you are aware of the regulations in force!

As a boater, you have a key role to play in protecting Posidonia meadows.

Here are a few measures you can take to minimise your impact:

1. Before setting off, consult the maps that indicate the presence of Posidonia meadows. There are several free apps that can help you, such as Nav&Co or Donia. Download them.
2. Don't anchor in Posidonia meadows: opt for sandy bottoms or consider picking up a mooring buoy whenever possible.
3. Respect protected areas: some regions have marine protected areas where anchoring and other activities are regulated to protect the seagrass meadows.

4. In all cases, adapt your anchoring technique: to avoid scraping the seabed, you must take care to bring your anchor back up in line with the boat, even if you are on sand.
5. Avoid generating any pollution at sea.
6. Share with others: not all boaters are aware of the importance of Posidonia seagrass meadows. And set an example!

By adopting these practices, you'll be helping to preserve Posidonia seagrass meadows and the health of Mediterranean marine ecosystems. Protecting these underwater treasures is an essential and shared responsibility for future generations.



## SAILING CONDITIONS

---

### SAILING AREA

With a boat rental in Trogir you can sail into the heart of the central Dalmatian Islands just to the south of the busy port of Split on the mainland.

When sailing from our base in Trogir you can also visit remote stunningly beautiful islands where you might be the only boat in the anchorage.

You'll also be able to visit Vis town's historic stone buildings including Garibaldi Palace, as well as its shops and restaurants. There are so many things to do in Vis, you'll soon see why it's one of the jewels of the Dalmatian Islands.

### WEATHER

The best time to visit Trogir is between May and October when the climate is sunny, hot and dry. The hottest and most crowded months to visit are July and August.

The average temperature in Trogir in summer is between 78°F and 95°F. The sea temperature in Trogir in summer is between 75°F and 82°F.

## TEMPERATURE

Climate in Trogir, Croatia:

- Summer high: The August high is around 87°F
- Winter low: The February low is 39°F

## WIND SYSTEMS

The sailing conditions for yacht charters in Trogir are perfect for sailors who actually want to sail in good winds instead of always motoring through calms.

Trogir's prevailing wind in the summer includes the north westerly mistral, which blows between 10 and 25 knots on a regular basis.

The north easterly bura (bora) features gusts that can range between 30 and 50 knots. If the Bura is forecast during your Trogir yacht charter, find a sheltered anchorage.

Meanwhile, the southerly jugo can also bring challenging weather conditions, including rain and wind up to 25 knots.

## LOCAL FORECAST

You can find weather forecasts ahead of your Trogir sailing charter from [Windguru](#). The weather is broadcasted on VHF channels 4, 7, 28 and 85 at 6:20am, 1:20pm and 10:20pm every day.
