BOARDING SCHEDULE

Boarding takes place at 3 pm. Prior to that, make an appointment with the base manager who will welcome you at the office, 18 rue de la trinquette.

BOAT BRIEFING

All briefings take place on board. Their duration varies from 40 to 60 minutes, depending on the boat size and crew experience.

Our team will review all the technical equipment of your boat with you, providing information for safe and precise navigation, including navigation instruments. Similarly, you'll receive anchoring and mooring advice as well as itinerary suggestions. The safety briefing will familiarize you with the safety equipment and the general inventory of your boat.

STOPOVERS

During your rental, you can make a stopover at the marina for free. You are kindly requested to spend your last night at the marina.

DISEMBARKATION SCHEDULE

Disembarkation is at 8 am for week-long rentals. You must return to the base the day before your departure by 5 pm. Please contact the base manager who will indicate the boat's location. Our team will conduct an equipment inspection of the boat and a quick check of the interior and exterior. A diver will inspect the hull, keel, propeller(s), and bow thruster. The general inspection will take about half an hour.

LUGGAGE

Please bring only soft travel bags as suitcases would be too bulky once on board. Ensure to bring non-marking shoes.

WASTE

Do not dispose of any waste at sea; stored and recyclable bins are available around the marina. For dishwashing, cleaning, and personal hygiene, prefer natural and biodegradable products.

FUEL

You must return the boat with a full tank. Otherwise, you'll be charged based on the engine hours + 50 euros for travel expenses.

BOAT CLEANING

We provide the boat in perfect cleanliness condition (if not, please notify us, and we'll address it). A consumables and final cleaning package is included in your contract; however, you must return the boat tidy, dishes washed and stored, trash disposed of, and the hull rinsed with clear water.

BATTERIES AND 220V CHARGER

Efficient energy management ensures a good cruise. Regularly check the voltmeter; if the voltage is below 12V, it's time to start the engine or connect to a dock. The electrical connection disconnects after 24 hours. Don't forget to reset it.

MARINE TOILETS

Marine toilets can easily clog. The golden rule is not to throw anything in them, as we recommend. If despite our advice, the toilets are clogged, do not force the pump or valves; you risk breaking them. Try disassembling the pump instead. The troubleshooting package is charged at 150 euros.


Parking is free in front of the docks.

ZONE GUIDE: LA ROCHELLE AND ITS SURROUNDING ISLANDS

WEATHER

The ideal period to visit La Rochelle and its surrounding islands is from April to October, with milder temperatures. July and August are the warmest months.

AREA PRESENTATION

The Charente coast is a gem for sailing enthusiasts. It's challenging to choose among numerous picturesque ports, stunning beaches, islands with breathtaking panoramas, peaceful anchorages, and charming coastal villages. La Rochelle and its surrounding islands offer an ideal setting for memorable vacations on the Atlantic coast.

Our base is located in La Rochelle's marina, providing easy access to nearby islands such as Île de Ré, Île d'Oléron, and Île d'Yeu. Navigators will have a plethora of options among stunning bays, tranquil coves, lively ports, and historically rich islands in the region.

The currents are notable, and the tides vary considerably, offering an ideal playground for sailors. A sailing license is not mandatory, but a solid experience is recommended, or engaging a local skipper to fully enjoy navigation in this region.

NAVIGATION IN PROTECTED CHANNELS

The La Rochelle region is blessed with channels offering sheltered navigation conditions, away from strong winds and Atlantic swells. These calm and secure water expanses allow for serene and pleasant crossings.

THE PERTUIS BRETON connects the Île de Ré to the mainland.

It is a relatively narrow stretch of sea, offering sheltered navigation conditions, ideal for beginners or for a tranquil family cruise. Its calm waters and coastal landscapes make it a highly sought-after navigation route. Recommended harbor: St. Martin, Ars-en-Ré.

THE PERTUIS D'ANTIOCHE separates the Île de Ré from the Île d'Oléron.

Although wider than the Pertuis d'Antioche, it remains relatively sheltered from the prevailing western winds. Navigators often find calmer navigation conditions here, facilitating movement between these two islands. Recommended harbor: Saint Denis, Boyardville, and Rochefort. Mooring buoys around the Île d'Aix.

Sailing through these channels is a delightful experience, offering a secure alternative for sailors wishing to avoid the more tumultuous conditions of the Atlantic Ocean.

MUST-SEE PLACES IN LA ROCHELLE AND ITS SURROUNDING ISLANDS

Explore Île de Ré: Nestled off the coast of La Rochelle, this island is full of charm with its picturesque villages and stunning beaches. Discover Île d'Oléron: The largest island on the French coast, renowned for its forts, fine sandy beaches, and fishing villages. Sail to Île d'Yeu: A unique island offering breathtaking landscapes, secluded coves, and a rich maritime heritage. Explore the Old Port of La Rochelle: Stroll along the historic harbor, admire the iconic buildings, charming cafes, and seafood restaurants. Discover Fort Boyard and Île d'Aix: Set course for these iconic symbols of the region, steeped in history and mystery.

NAVIGATION CONDITIONS

The region offers varied navigation conditions with regular winds. Tides can be powerful, especially around the islands; it's essential to consider them in your travel planning.

WEATHER FORECASTS AND TIDES

Check the weather and tide schedules daily to bring the boat back on time and to the right port. Forecasts are available from your departure marina.



Remember that your safety and that of others are paramount. In case of doubt or issues, do not hesitate to contact the base manager or the harbor authorities.
