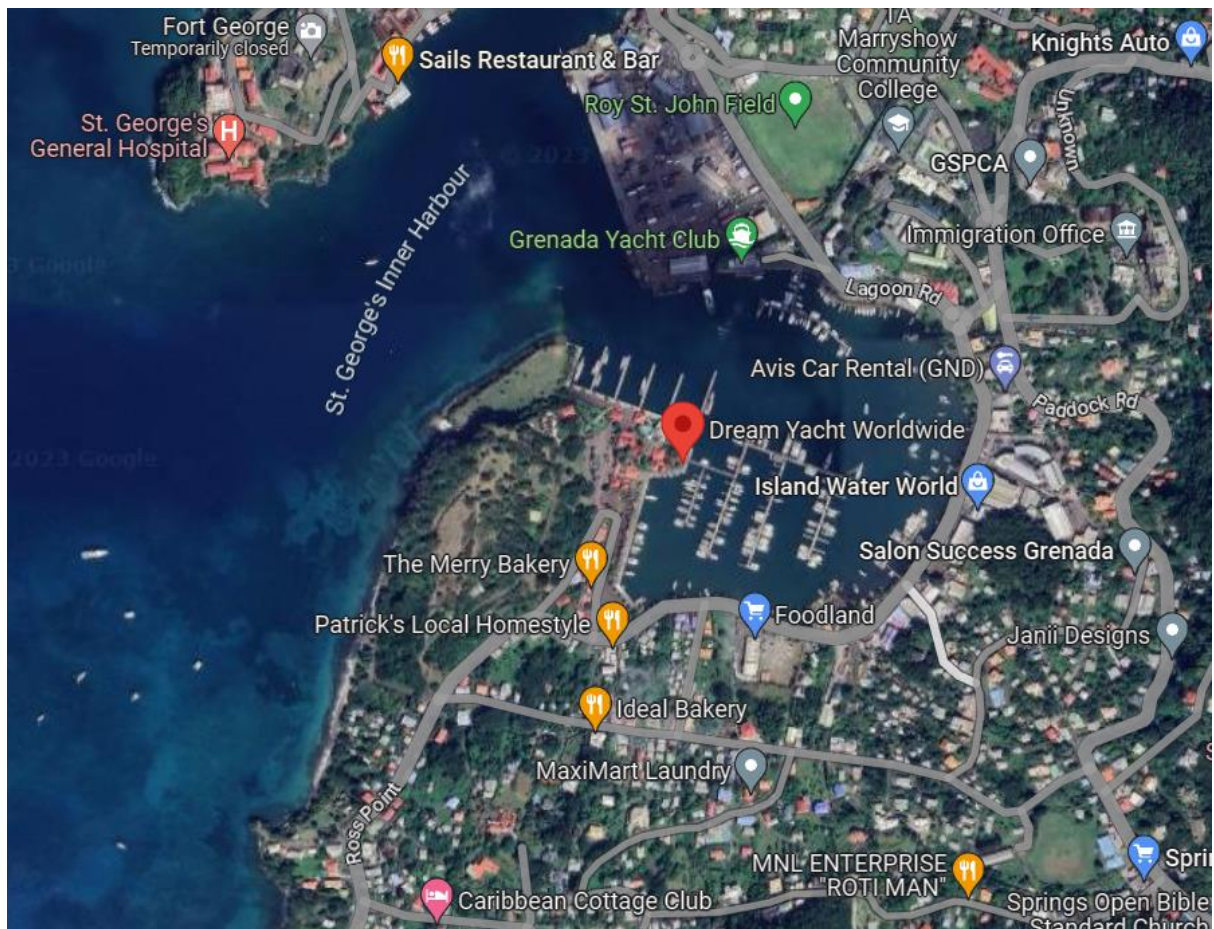

INCLUSIONS & EXCLUSIONS

The rates include:

- First & last night at the Dream Yacht base
- The boat and its equipment, dinghy, and outboard engine
- Service of the crew (skipper, hostess/cook)
- Full board is standard on Easy Crewed Charters in Grenada: breakfast, lunch and dinner including soft drinks
- Linen: 1 set of linen / cabin / charter (1 set = 2 sheets / 2 pillow cases / 1 blanket),

HOW TO GET THERE?

ACCESS BY PLANE

Maurice Bishop International Airport (GND): The airport is 9km from the base, which is a 20-minute journey by car/shuttle. There are regular flights from Trinidad, Barbados, Miami and New York with Liat, American Airlines and JetBlue. Please check the schedule on the [airport website](#).

The marina is located in the capital, St. George's, a two-minute drive from downtown.

ACCESS BY BUS

The marina is accessible by the local buses. All bus routes are numbered. Clients will need to select any Number 1 bus.

It is essential that each passenger must have a passport valid for 6 months after the return date. A copy of your passports, of your flight details and any know food restrictions or medical diet must be sent at least 2 weeks before your departure to your cruise' organizer.

AREA GUIDE

SAILING AREA

The nation of Grenada is a chain of several islands including Grenada, Carriacou and Petite Martinique. It's also the gateway to the unspoiled cruising grounds of the Grenadines, which promises some of the best sailing anywhere in the Caribbean.

With a unique combination of French and English culture, exotic flowers and rare fruits, a rich history of storytelling and well-seasoned foods, it's no wonder Grenada is known as the "Island of Spice". The country gets its nickname because it is a leading producer of cinnamon, cloves, ginger, mace, allspice and nutmeg.

Beautiful beaches make up the coastline, including the 1.9 mile-long Grand Anse Beach in St. George Paris, which frequently appears on top 10 lists of the world's greatest beaches. The marine life is

spectacular here and you'll spot turtles, rays, dolphins and a spectrum of tropical fish during your Grenada yacht vacation.

TOP THINGS TO DO IN GRENADA:

1. Dive or snorkel at the underwater sculpture park: Located in the shallow waters off Molinere Point, the Sculpture Park is one of Grenada's most popular snorkeling sites. The intriguing collection of figures was created by British sculptor Jason de Caires Taylor and serves as an artificial reef.
2. Dougaldston spice estate: Learn about Grenada's rich history with a tour of this estate that still processes cinnamon, nutmeg, cloves and more. See how cocoa is manufactured, how spices are processed, and pick up some fresh spices to take home with you.
3. Explore St. George's: One of our favorite things to do in Grenada is strolling through this harbor town, known as one of the most impressive cities in the Caribbean. The rainbow-colored buildings with red-tiled roofs house a number of unique shops, as well as outstanding restaurants.
4. Royal Mount Carmel Waterfalls: Consisting of two falls that plunge more than 70 feet to the pools below, some say these are the best falls on the island. Consider hiring a guide to ensure you find them.
5. Grand Anse Beach: The peaceful surroundings and soft white sand are quintessential Caribbean. Stop by for some lounge time during your Grenada yacht charter, so you can visit the locals and enjoy a refreshing cocktail.

WEATHER

The climate of Grenada is tropical climate, hot and humid all year round, with a relatively cool and dry season from January to mid-April, and a hot, humid and rainy season from June to December. The driest months are typically January to May. From June to December the rain usually falls in brief, heavy showers.

TEMPERATURE

Climate in Grenada:

- Summer High: The June high is around 81°F (27°C)

WHAT TO PACK

- Soft luggage that you can fold away or roll up - hard suitcases are hard to fit in your cabin and there is nowhere to store them onboard
- Reef-friendly sunblock and sun cream
- Dry bags or zip lock bags to protect your money, cameras and mobiles
- Seasickness bands and tablets are good for novice sailors
- Earplugs and eyeshades are great for light sleepers
- Keep clothing light and remember you will be around water a lot! Don't forget several swimsuits, hat, sunglasses and an extra beach towel (even though towels are provided)
- When it comes to shoes, you're likely to be barefoot onboard so pack just one pair for going ashore and some water shoes for reefs
- Leave expensive jewellery, make-up and hair straighteners behind – it's time to relax!
