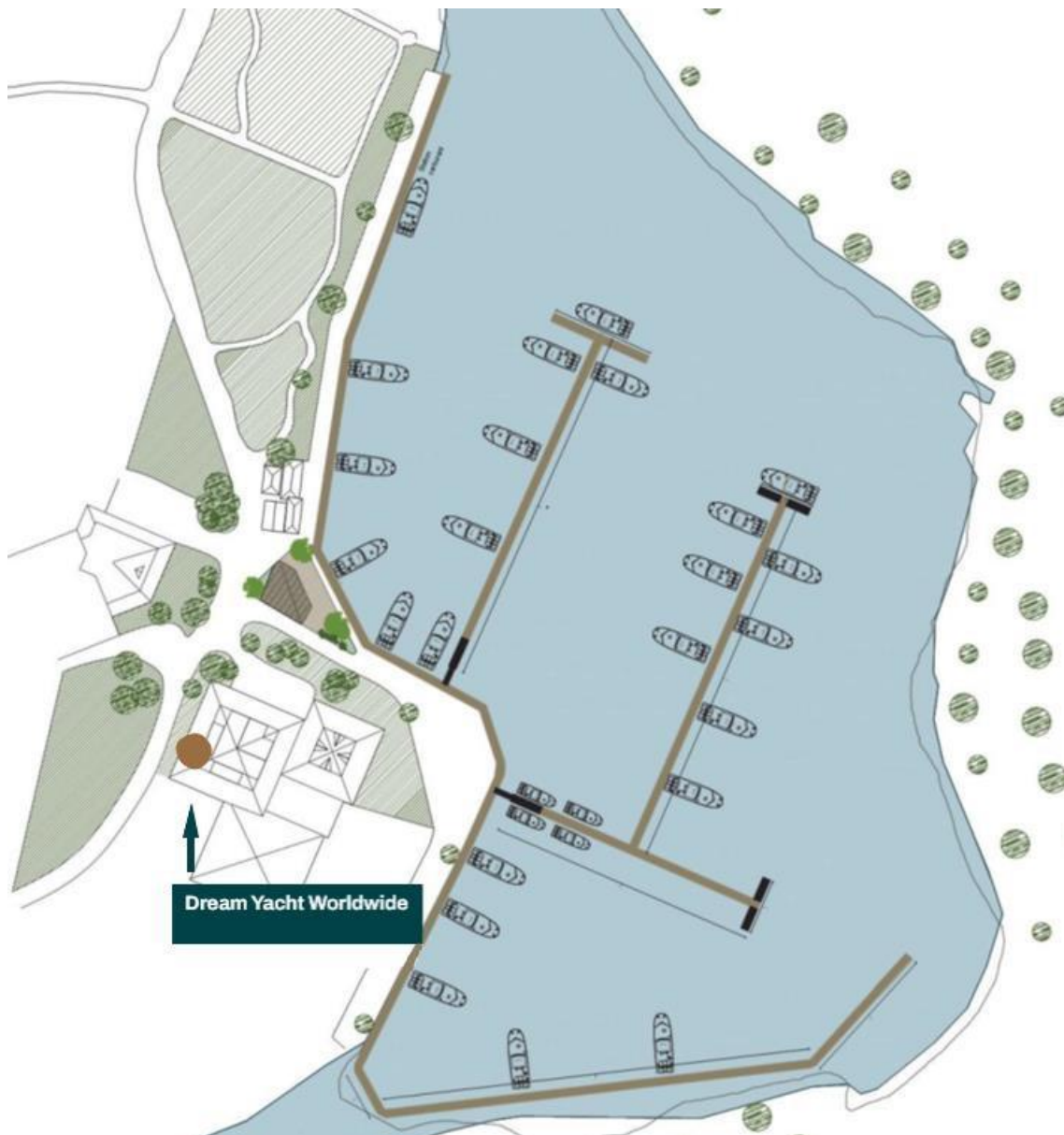

INCLUSIONS & EXCLUSIONS

The rates include:

- First & last night at the Dream Yacht base
- The boat and its equipment, dinghy, and outboard engine
- Service of the crew (skipper, hostess/cook)
- Full board is standard on Easy Crewed Charters in St. Martin: breakfast, lunch and dinner including soft drinks
- Linen: 1 set of linen / cabin / charter (1 set = 2 sheets / 2 pillow cases / 1 blanket),
Towels: 1 set of towels / pax / charter (1 set = 1 face towel / 1 bath towel / 1 beach towel)
- Consumables for the yacht (diesel, fuel and water)
- Water sports on board: snorkeling gear & 1 paddleboard
- End cleaning
- Harbour and mooring fees
- On catamarans 54 ft and larger: shower gel & shampoo plus a 2nd paddleboard

The rates do not include:

- Cruising and tourist taxes, clearance and custom fees, island fees if there are any
- Cancellation insurance and private insurance
- Alcoholic drinks (possible to order separately) and special meal requests
- Personal expenses and excursions
- Crew gratuity

HOW TO GET THERE?

ACCESS BY PLANE

Princess Juliana International Airport (SXM): There are regular flights from various US cities and direct flights from Paris. The taxi transfer to our marina takes 30 minutes.

Grand-Case Esperance Airport (SFG) is on the French side of the island and is used mainly for regional flights from nearby Caribbean islands.

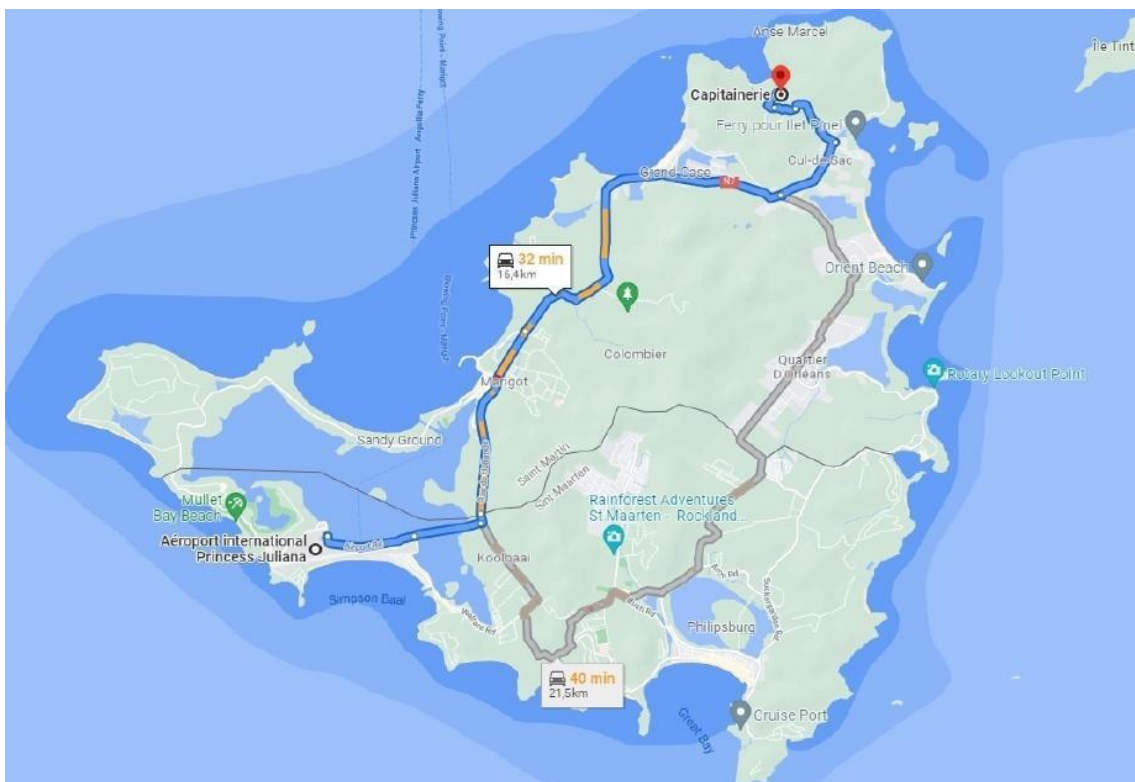
VERY IMPORTANT : Register a New Sint Maarten Entry Form

Complete your official entry form prior to arrival in Sin Maarten. This digital entry form is the official Embarkation Disembarkation (ED) Card for travelling to (Dutch) Sint Maarten. All travellers residing, transferring through or visiting Sin Maarten and St. Martin (French side) are required to fill out this form. It is essential that each passenger must have a passport valid for 6 months after the return date. A copy of your passports, of your flight details and any know food restrictions or medical diet must be sent at least 2 weeks before your departure to your cruise' organizer.

AREA GUIDE

SAILING AREA

St. Martin is second only to the British Virgin Islands as our most popular sailing area in the Caribbean. Sailing St. Martin allows you to explore some of the beautiful islands in the eastern Caribbean, including mainland St. Martin, Anguilla and St. Barts. Divers and snorkelers can enjoy some of the most spectacular unspoiled reefs in the world.

St. Martin is located about 150 miles north of Guadeloupe and is part of the Leeward Islands in the Caribbean Sea. It is the smallest landmass in the world shared by two independent countries, in this case, France and the Netherlands.

Because of the country's French and Dutch sides, you'll enjoy an interesting dual culture on your St. Martin sailing charter. It's a destination where sophistication is blended with a relaxed, easy-going style. This ethos is woven into the fabric of daily life on the island.

Caribbean and European food, culture and cuisine come together on St. Martin like no other place in the island chain. The island gives you a taste of the delightful charms of this region with world-class restaurants, casual beach bars, legendary and (sometimes infamous) beaches, live music and fascinating colonial history.

St. Martin sailing charters need to include a visit to the nearby island of Anguilla, where uncrowded beaches are dotted with quaint beach bars and cafes. Road Bay is the main port of Anguilla, and it's a charming village set on a stunning beach.

Sailing to the island of St. Barts is a St. Martin yacht charter favorite. Shopping and dining are at their best in the lovely European-influenced port town of Gustavia. The beaches are equally appealing, including the little known Shell Beach and the scenic Saline Beach.

TOP THINGS TO DO IN ST MARTIN:

1. Visit quiet Tintamare Sail to Tintamare, a pristine island just off of St. Martin's east coast in the heart of the nature reserve. Anchor off the deserted white sandy beach to swim, go shell hunting and hiking. Later, enjoy a secluded evening onboard, dining under the stars – it's one of our favorite things to do in St. Martin.

2. Join the 'in crowd' at St. Barts Set sail early to St Barts, the island of billionaires, and anchor outside the red-roofed harbor at the island's Capital, Gustavia. Enjoy an evening ashore, complete with fine dining, exploring and nightlife.

3. Dine at Grand-Case On your Caribbean yacht charter, sail to Grand-Case, a protected cove on St. Martin known for its excellent dining opportunities. This village features colorful houses, beach bars and restaurants serving French and Creole cuisine

4. Sail to Pinel Island Tiny Pinel Island is a local favorite, just off the southeastern coast of St. Martin. This little treasure is well-protected from the wind, making it a haven for kayakers, snorkelers and hikers, as well as those seeking a relaxed rum punch on the beach. Get there early to stake your place on the sand.

5. Anchor at Anse de Colombier This secluded and protected anchorage is difficult to reach other than by boat, but you should put it on your list of things to do in St. Martin. Enjoy the beautiful beach, hike the trail leading to sweeping views of the sea and see nearby islands. Then settle aboard your yacht to watch the stunning sunset.

WEATHER

The best time to visit St. Martin is during the dry season, between January and June. The region's climate is inter-tropical with air and sea temperatures around 82°F (28°C) year-round. There is only a slight variation between the dry season (January till June) and the wet season (June till December). There is no real rainy season like on the neighboring islands, you just might experience light rains during the day.

TEMPERATURE

Climate in St Martin:

- Summer high: The August high is around 88°F (31°C)
- Winter low: The December low is 70°F (21°C)

WHAT TO PACK

- Soft luggage that you can fold away or roll up - hard suitcases are hard to fit in your cabin and there is nowhere to store them onboard
- Reef-friendly sunblock and sun cream
- Dry bags or zip lock bags to protect your money, cameras and mobiles
- Seasickness bands and tablets are good for novice sailors
- Earplugs and eyeshades are great for light sleepers



- Keep clothing light and remember you will be around water a lot! Don't forget several swimsuits, hat, sunglasses and an extra beach towel (even though towels are provided)
- When it comes to shoes, you're likely to be barefoot onboard so pack just one pair for going ashore and some water shoes for reefs
- Leave expensive jewellery, make-up and hair straighteners behind – it's time to relax
